

S.N.A.C. Report
Meeting of 18th November 2015

Cindy Finn gave a detailed presentation on the special needs population at LBPSB.:

- from a total of 20, 613 students there are 1,587 students in difficulty or at risk and 973 with handicaps making a total of 2560 or 12.4% with special needs.
- 1 in 4 students are on an IEP
- 69% of the students are in H.S. and 31% are in Elementary
- of those students coded 48% are secondary and 52% are elementary students
- 45% of students with codes are autistic
- the government gives the school board \$6,000 for every student but gives more money to coded students

<u>codes 33 and 34</u>	<u>all other codes</u>
K \$9,438	\$14,701
elementary \$11,446	\$17,863
secondary \$10,728	\$16,744

- if a child moves, the government will not always send the information to the new school, especially in a new school board.
- parents need to make sure the information is sent.
- SNAC will give a parent-to-parent IEP workshop on Tuesday, February 2nd, 2016, from 7:00 to 9:00 pm at LBPSB school board.
- SNAC will work with CPC to create a new Parent Newsletter that will be distributed a few times a year.
- SNAC responded to the Enrollment Criteria Consultation, reiterating the importance of Bilingual programs.
